

Administrative Order
No. 2007- 07


The Court has unanimously adopted this Administrative Order, which provides, with the exception set forth below, that Senior Status Judges in this District Court are not required to but are eligible to vote on any and all matters of internal court administration, unless otherwise barred from doing so by current or future statutory restrictions. Matters of internal court administration would include, for example only, the appointment of Magistrate Judges, the appointment of senior staff of this District Court, and the adoption of Local Rules of Court. The sole exception to this eligibility to vote is that Senior Status Judges are not eligible to vote on policy matters directly affecting the workload of the active Judges of the Court as may arise from time to time. This exception, however, does not affect the ability of Senior Status Judges to determine the types, number and/or frequency of cases that they will be assigned. Senior Status Judges may vote in any manner, such as by phone, by email or in person, as otherwise available to active Judges.




