

The Court recognizes the invaluable role that Senior Status Judges have in both the disposition of cases assigned to them as well as their participation in the internal administration of the Court. The need for them to become fully participating and voting members of the Court has increased as the number of Senior Status Judges on the Court has increased; otherwise, a significant number of district judges will have less than full representation on the Court's internal administrative operation.


The Court, therefore, has approved and adopted by vote of the active district judges this Administrative Order, which removes from previous Administrative Order No. 2007-07 the restriction that "Senior Status Judges are not eligible to vote on policy matters directly affecting the workload of the [A]ctive Judges of the Court as may arise from time to time". In all other respects, Administrative Order No. 2007-07 remains in full force and effect.


