
ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

Pursuant to the provisions of the Criminal Justice Act, Title 18, U.S.C. § 3006A(a)(1) and(c), the Office of the Federal Public Defender for the Western District of Tennessee is hereby appointed to represent any defendant previously determined to have been entitled to appointment of counsel or who is now indigent, to determine whether that defendant may qualify to seek a reduction of sentence pursuant to the United States Sentencing Commission Guidelines for such applications.

The United States Probation Office and the United States District Court Clerk's Office for the Western District of Tennessee are authorized to disclose Presentence Investigation Reports and Statements of Reasons to the Federal Public Defender's Office for the purpose of determining eligibility for relief, and for determining whether a conflict of interest precludes the Federal Public Defender from representing a client. Should the Federal Public Defender determine that there is a prohibitive conflict in which the prospective client's interests are materially adverse to those of a current or former client with regard to representation of a particular defendant in this litigation, the Federal Public Defender will so notify the Court. Those cases will be referred to the Magistrate Judges for appointment of counsel.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
