## St. Mary's Episcopal School 3-Branches of Government Field Trip

On May 10, 2024, the 8<sup>th</sup> grade class from St. Mary's Episcopal School visited the District Court as part of a 3-Branches of Government Field Trip. The class observed a sentencing hearing before District Judge Thomas L. Parker and held a mock trial using facts from the landmark First Amendment Rights case *Tinker vs. Des Moines Independent School District*. The group met with representatives from the U.S. Attorney's Office, Federal Defender's Office, and U.S. Probation Office prior to the sentencing for pre-hearing discussions. They toured the U.S. Marshals Service Office and then had lunch with the judges and posed for a group photo before heading off to visit the branches of the county and city governments.

The students had insightful questions about the sentencing process, current events, and the role of each agency.
